This month, we were lucky enough to welcome Hanna from the Us programme to join us for a Year 12 and 13 assembly delivered virtually. 'Us' is a charity that works to educate and inspire females from disadvantaged backgrounds. Hanna was promoting the 'She Who Discovers' event to be held online at the end of September. This involves a variety of workshops aiming to improve self-image of girls and empower them to develop their own academic passions.

Hanna took us on a powerful and personal journey of her own experience of overcoming difficulties of coming to the UK as a refugee and not achieving the grades she needed. She inspired our students to register for a digital event that supports students in overcoming difficulties such as these, as well as encouraging students to share and reflect on how to become more self-confident. It was an honour and a pleasure to hear such a personal journey of success. Hanna is now studying Accounting and Finance at the University of Warwick and will hopefully meet some of our wonderful alumni over the coming weeks.



Early Entry Candidates

Applying for any of the early entry universities and courses is always a race against time at the start of Year 13, but LAET students love a goal to aim for and have been doing wonderful work since term began (and of course in the many months before). More than 40 students will be applying to Oxford and Cambridge and similar numbers for Medicine, Veterinary Science or Dentistry.

Naomi from 'Open' tutor group who is applying to study Human, Social, and Political Sciences at Cambridge University said: "It's been difficult balancing all the preparation that I want to get done such as summer schools, personal statement, webinars/workshops and college research. However, the support that I've received from teachers has been very helpful." Toni from 'Kings' tutor group who is applying to study Law at Oxford University tells us the trickiest bit of all by saying: "My biggest challenge has been trying to combine everything I have done, read and want to say into only 4000 characters. They should give us more!"

This is still only the beginning of the journey but the students have already achieved so much and the buzz that can be heard in extension classes across the school bodes well!

Clubs are an important aspect of the culture at LAET, and all students are expected to participate in a club in a weekly basis.

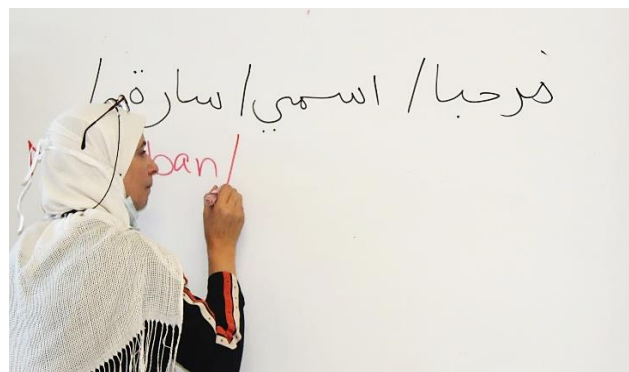
We've seen a great start to this year, with many new exciting clubs on offer and some really great engagement and participation from our students.

I have noticed changes in myself so far because I am more confident in my lessons and I don't shy away from asking questions."
